



Student Quiz/Essay/Cartoon Contest

All students must answer the 9 chapter questions (5 points each). Students have the option to complete the essay or draw an editorial cartoon (either option is 55 points). Students may opt to enter the contest both ways; however, a student can only win once.

Essay question: *In "Hooch," Kenny Rascoe is tempted by the promise of easy money and popularity to do what he knows is wrong. Explain a time when you or someone you know had a hard time choosing between right and wrong. What were the consequences of the choice? Give specific examples.*

Editorial Cartoon Option: *Draw an original editorial cartoon based on the theme of choosing between right and wrong.*

Rules

1. To enter, each student can answer the attached quiz *or* go online and complete the student quiz/essay found at <http://tinyurl.com/hoochquiz>
2. This student evaluation is made up of 9 questions, one for each chapter of the serial story, "Hooch," and one essay question or editorial cartoon. The chapter questions are worth 5 points each. The essay or editorial cartoon is worth a total of 55 points, for a test total of 100 points.
3. Students can go back and change answers until they hit the final submission button. There is no time limit. However, SurveyBob or internet connect issues may disrupt your submission. The first complete attempt is the one that will be considered for submission into the contest.
4. The essay must be no more than 150 words long. Students are expected to use proper English. Spelling and punctuation count. Use of texting shorthand or emoticons will result in disqualification. To make the essay portion faster and easier to complete online, students may type it first into a word processing program and paste it into the essay portion of this quiz. If completing the quiz/essay on paper, the essay may be typed into a computer, printed out and attached to the paper quiz.
5. The editorial cartoon must be the original work of the student. Any contest entry viewed by the judges to be a copy, reproduction, variation or interpretation of another cartoonist's work will be disqualified. Your cartoon must be drawn on white paper, no larger than 8 ½" x 11" unlined, using black ink. No color or pencil drawings. Cartoon entries will be judged on creativity, originality, simplicity, effective interpretation of the topic and correct spelling. You may submit entries electronically by emailing hoochcartoon@gmail.com. Scans of original artwork must be in PDF or JPEG format and must not exceed 2 MB. Remember, you still need to submit your answers to the 9 chapter questions. Please include these within the body of your email and be sure to include all the information asked under Rule 9. If submitting your cartoon via

postal mail, please *do not* fold your entries and include a completed copy of the paper quiz, attached with a paper clip or one staple.

6. Two top entries will be selected for each participating newspaper. There will be up to 10 regional winners, 5 for each category – essay or editorial cartoon, from across the state. After state winners have been determined, the names of all winners will announced via a press release to all daily newspapers across New York State.
7. Winners will be notified by phone or email through their school.
8. Employees of the local newspaper and their immediate family members are not eligible to win.
9. Each entry must be the sole product of the student’s work. The student’s name and complete contact information **MUST** be entered at the time of submission to be eligible. This information includes:
 - a. Newspaper used to follow the story (either in-print or online)
 - b. Student’s full name
 - c. Student’s grade
 - d. School name (If home schooled type home)
 - e. School address (If home schooled provide home address)
 - f. Teacher’s name
 - g. Teacher’s email address or school phone number (to notify student winners)
10. Students must in grades 4, 5, 6, 7 or 8. Students may enter by mail or through any internet connection available to them but **MUST** include the above contact information. Students are welcome to enter both the quiz/essay and quiz/editorial cartoon contests, however, each student may only win once.
